
Conversational Style

Model Conversation:

- $A \rightarrow B$ (1): How was your Silver Week vacation?
- $B \rightarrow A(2)$: It was fantastic!
- $C \rightarrow B(3)$: Really! Why?
- $B \rightarrow C$ (4): Well, I went to Cebu.
- $D \rightarrow B(5)$: Where's Cebu?
- $A \rightarrow D$ (6): Oh, it's in the Philippines.
- $D \rightarrow B$ (7): So, what did you do?
- $B \rightarrow D(8)$: Every morning, I went snorkeling. There was a beautiful white-sand beach in front of my hotel with coral reefs.
- $C \rightarrow B$ (9): I went snorkeling last year in Okinawa. I saw so many fish.
- $D \rightarrow C$ (10): What type of fish?
- $C \rightarrow D$ (11): I saw Nemo you know, that fish from the Disney movie.
- $A \rightarrow C$ (12): Oh, that's called a clown fish...



Discussion Pointers:

- You don't need to wait to give your opinion.
- When somebody *gives an opinion*, you can:
 - a. agree with them \rightarrow give more information
 - b. disagree with them \rightarrow give reasons for your disagreement
- When somebody *makes a comment*, you can:
 - a. add to their comment \rightarrow give your own information (e.g. personal experience)
 - b. ask them a question
- During a discussion, there should be *no long pauses of silence* after somebody has asked a question or made a comment.
- Speakers do not have to give their opinion in order; they can *speak in random order*.
