

# Correction Symbols Activity

*Identify each mistake with the appropriate correction symbol and then make the appropriate correction.*

As with all (1) variety, the differences between Australian English and Canadian English lie in the areas of pronunciation, grammar and vocabulary. Among these differences, however, similarities are evident due to their shared (2) culture heritage and (3) politic status through Britain. As for grammar and usage, it is difficult to identify the features that distinguish these two varieties. (4) In addition, clippings to show informality in Australian English and compound structures to produce idiomatic language in Canadian English are indeed distinct grammatical features. In addition, both (5) has discourse markers, adverbial *but* in Australian English and *eh* in Canadian English, that are particular to these (6) dilects. Finally, both varieties have words and expressions borrowed from their indigenous cultures, as well as vocabulary items unique to their own natural environments. Australian English and Canadian English (7) had a long road to take to become standard varieties, but continued interest (8) on these varieties will maintain their status, and hopefully unfastened the stereotypes attached to them.
