

# How to Explain a Map

Use these steps and expressions to explain the maps during your presentation.

1. **Introduce** the map.

- e. Toronto, Vancouver and Montreal are the major cities.

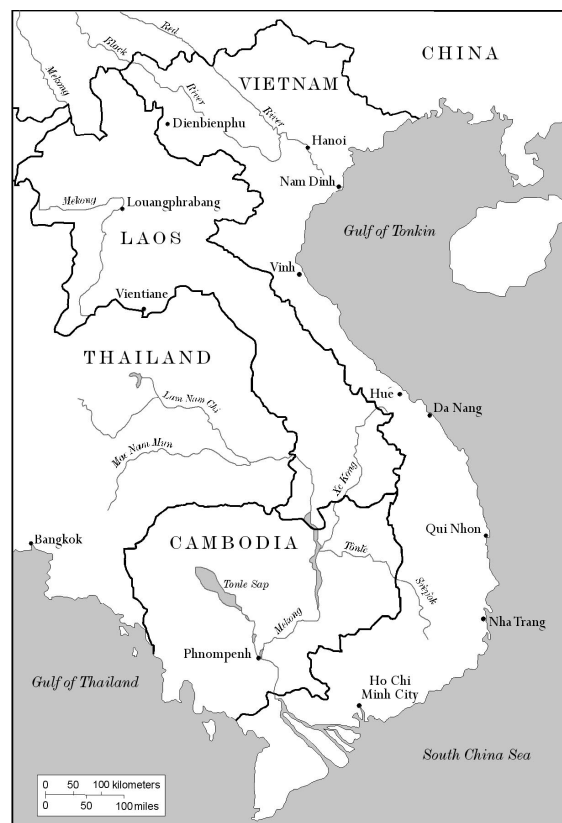

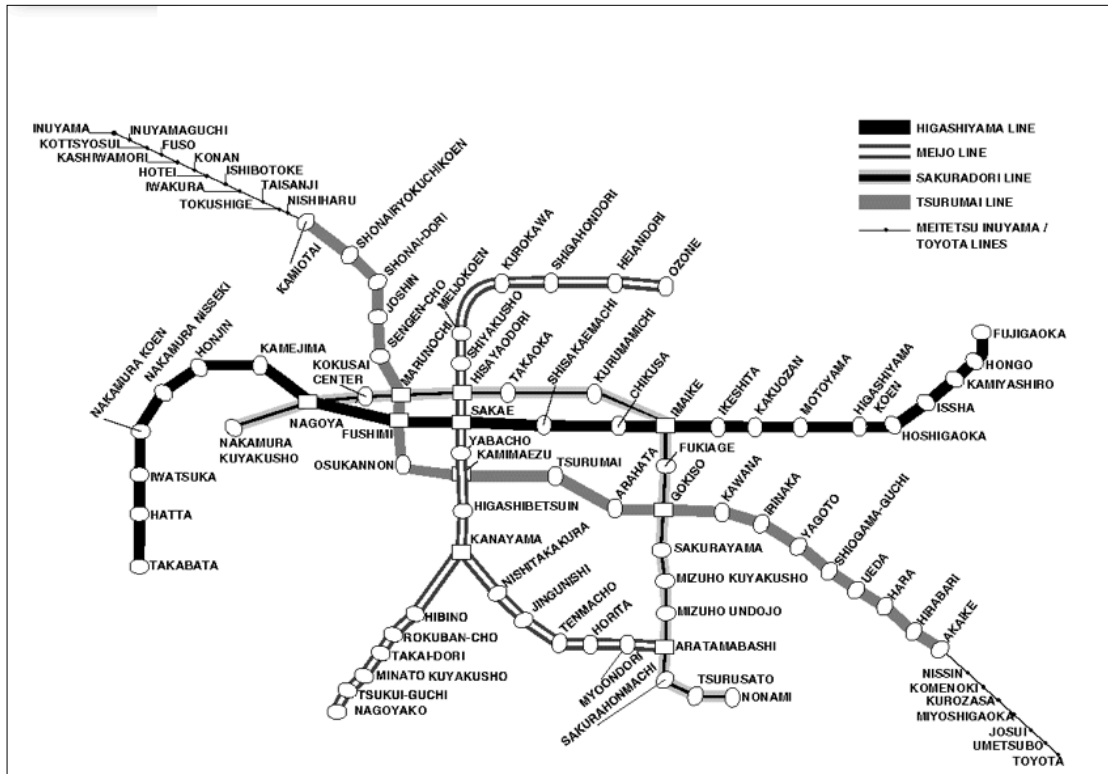
